**FORT WORTH, TX – March 15, 2017** – In a musical tribute to one of the greatest spies of all time, the Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra performs *007: The Music of James Bond and Beyond!* **March 31-April 2, 2017** in Bass Performance Hall. Guest conductor Stuart Malina will lead the orchestra in a concert that also features vocalist Rachel York performing iconic hits from more than five decades of Bond films such *Goldfinger*, *A View to Kill*, *Moonraker*, *Live and Let Die*, and others. In addition to music from the Bond movies, the orchestra will also play music from other noir-themed films such as *Pink Panther*, *Mission Impossible*, *From Russia with Love*, and more.

Performances are **Friday, March 31, 2017** and **Saturday, April 1, 2017** at **7:30 PM**, and **Sunday, April 2, 2017** at **2:00 PM**. All concerts take place at Bass Performance Hall. **Rachel York** is a dynamic and versatile actress, singer, dancer and comedienne. She is best known for her critically acclaimed Broadway performances in *City of Angels*, *Les Misérables*, *Victor/Victoria* (Drama Desk Award) with Dame Julie Andrews, *The Scarlet Pimpernel*, *Sly Fox* with Richard Dreyfuss, and *Dirty Rotten Scoundrels* co-starring Jonathan Pryce.

An active concert artist, York's recent appearances include *Broadway Showstoppers* with Peter Nero and the Philly Pops, *The Sound of Music* at the Hollywood Bowl with the Los Angeles Philharmonic under the direction of John Mauceri, the National Symphony and the Pittsburgh Symphony under the direction of conductor Marvin Hamlisch, Jacksonville Symphony, Minnesota Orchestra, Detroit Symphony, St. Louis Symphony, San Diego Symphony, and the Hong Kong Philharmonic among many others.
